MOBILE PHONES

Please be aware that students are not to have their mobile phones on them during the school day. All phones must be handed in to the class teacher as soon as students enter the class. This is a safety issue as well as a child protection issue. The school has been informed that some students have brought phones to school without parents' permission, refused to hand them in or hidden their phones. During the day, they are then accessing their phones to either go on 'Snap Chat' or take photos of other students.

To maintain safety and good order, if your child refuses to hand in their mobile phone the school may require you to either collect the phone from your child or your child may be given a 'Take Home' behaviour consequence. Consequences will escalate based on issues at hand.

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Premier's Reading Challenge

What is the Challenge?

The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program. Students are required to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September. All students from Reception to Year 12 are encouraged to participate.

Students can read a combination of books from the Challenge booklists and books of their own choosing. Students can choose to read books in languages other than English. The booklists are available on the Premier's Reading Challenge website, www.prc.sa.edu.au

Reception to Year 7 students select at least 8 books from the booklists on the Premier's Reading Challenge website and 4 books of their own choice.

Students who complete the Challenge receive awards from the Premier.

The Premier's Reading Challenge complements other school and community literacy initiatives including the Accelerated Literacy Program, the Early Years Literacy Program, MS Readathon and The Little Big Book Club.

Benefits of taking part in the Challenge:

- Raises the profile of reading, libraries and literacy in schools.
- Gives students a focus for their reading.
- Encourages students to read more books and enjoy reading more - the more you read the better you get at it!
- Offers incentives for reluctant readers.
- Builds self-esteem and pride, school unity, and a sense of achievement.
- Increases the involvement of parents in their child's reading.

**Does your child need to get a flu shot?
It could be easier!**

Some children don't mind getting needles while other kids don't like needles at all! This fear often stems from bad experiences as a child. But we are learning that there are simple things we can do by just guiding kids' attention and talking to them positively afterwards that can make needles go better!

Our research aims to reduce the negative impact of needle procedures in children. We are doing research to see if 2 different strategies – dividing attention and using positive language after a needle – can reduce needle pain and fear in children undergoing flu vaccinations in South Australia.

Your child can participate if they:

- are between 8-12 years
- attend school in South Australia
- consent to receive the yearly flu vaccination
- have no history of a severe allergic reaction after a vaccine
- have no severe egg allergies

if your child is eligible to participate, they will receive a **FREE** flu vaccination at the University of South Australia Physiotherapy Clinic (City East Campus).
