PORT RD BIKE LANES – A MESSAGE FROM CHARLES STURT COUNCIL

As you may be aware, the Department of Planning, Transport & Infrastructure (DIPTI) have recently changed the times at the bicycle lanes are active along Port Road. Officers from DIPTI have patrolled the section of Port Road near the school and have found a large amount of people queuing in the bicycle lane. Any vehicles who are seen stopped in the bicycle lanes during the times that they are active will be at risk of receiving a \$282.00 fine. **The new times are 7am – 10am and 3pm to 7pm – Monday to Friday.**

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Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education This data is used as the basis for national funding.

The NCCD involves the collection of;

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students
- student's type of disability if known

Under the model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions. If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection.
