ATTENDANCE REMINDER

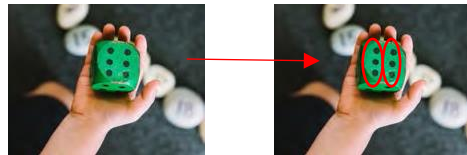
Math in Room 7: Subi-what?? Subitise!!

Subitising is the ability to instantly recognise the number of objects or dots in a small set or arrangement without counting. For example, it's being able to instantly recognise the number of dots on dice, dominoes or the number of cookies on a plate!

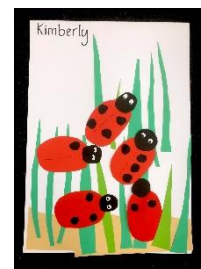
The Importance of Teaching Subitising:

Subitising is a developmental prerequisite to counting. We are practicing our subitising using a variety of different activities such as: magic dots, dominoes, dice and more!

Subitising contributes to early forms of grouping. Seeing parts of a whole or that numbers are made up of other numbers, such as; the number 5 can be seen as 3 and 2 or 4 and 1, or the number 6 can be seen as 3 and 3.



This understanding will lay the foundation for future learning (multiplication, division and measurement).
